#### 2. SITE EVALUATION: Buildings and Site History


Mount Harris was founded in 1914 when the Colorado-Utah Coal Company purchased the land to begin a coal mining venture. Two brothers from Iowa, Byron and George Harris, were in charge of developing this mining town which would become home to many people over the next 44 years.

Mount Harris was noted as a "model coal camp." The streets were wide and tree-lined, and a large natural grove of cottonwood trees was made into a playground. The residential area was planned out generously, allowing homes to be scattered for more than half a mile, each with liberal yards and gardens for each family. A baseball park in the center of

town was home to one of the best teams in the Yampa Valley League, and the sand rocks from the Gibraltar rocks below the town were used to build the business district. A single rock building housed a mine office, general store, drug store, pool hall, barber shop, and post office, each business having its own separate entrance. Two doctors were in residence, with one on call at all times. A unique two-level filling station serviced Highway 40 from the top level and local town residents from the lower level. The town also boasted three boarding houses and a community center for dances, meetings, and movies. In 1916, the coal company built a four-room grade school.

Two other mines operated in the area employing Mount Harris residents. The original Colorado-Utah Coal mine operated from 1914 to 1958, with its entrance on the south side of the Yampa River. The Wadge mine was opened in 1887 by James and his wife, Sarah Jane, who homesteaded the land. The Wadge mine entrance was on the north side of present-day Highway 40 and operated until 1942, when a disastrous explosion occurred, taking the lives of 34 miners. The Wolf Creek Mine ran from 1915 until 1942 and was located up the draw north of the Wadge Mine.

The tunnel mining era ended on May 20, 1958, when the Mt. Harris Coal Company auctioned

off the entire town. The houses and mining equipment were sold and moved, and the town of Mount Harris became only a memory for those who lived there.

The narrative of Mt. Harris makes the landscape come alive when you pass by the blank canvas of this once-vibrant community. Karen Whitney, the current owner of the former Mt. Harris site, initiated the concept behind the project to locate and chronicle as many of the Mt. Harris homes as possible before the history is lost. While locating and documenting homes, the story of Mt. Harris evolved, creating the context of understanding for this cultural landscape in Northwest Colorado.

The story unfolded as we spoke with relatives of former residents and located some of the homes of the largest coal company town in Routt County. The land is now privately owned but still holds remnants of the past occupants visible upon the landscape. Many homes auctioned off in 1958 were moved to nearby locations within the region and used as housing and outbuildings or were dismantled and used for lumber. The buildings tell the story of how the communities in Northwest Colorado developed, and it is crucial to document the remaining structures before they disappear. Northwest Colorado, like other areas, has seen rapid growth along with gentrification. More demolition permits are requested than

historical designations are issued, and many of these structures have yet to stand the test of time.

First Thing First: Building the Database for Mount Harris, was made possible by a generous grant from the National Trust for Historic Preservation. We would also like to thank Karen Whitney, the current owner of the former Mt. Harris site, for having the vision to initiate this project in a partnership between Historic Routt County, The Hayden Heritage Center in Hayden, Colorado, and The University of Colorado, Denver, Architecture Department.



#### 3. DATA GATHERING AND GENERAL SITE PROCEDURES

#### Methodology & Findings

The initial research focused on existing materials gathered by Historic Routt County and the Hayden Heritage Center. Materials included historic photographs, oral histories, and personal accounts by former residents of Mt. Harris during a summer gathering in 2021. Additional materials were gathered from the Denver Public Library Western History Collection and History Colorado archives. Historic Routt County and the Hayden Heritage Center reached out to local residents through their organization's websites, and local newspaper ads requesting addresses to known houses moved from the mining town. A database of existing Mount Harris homes was developed from former Mt. Harris homes in Craig, Hayden, Oak Creek, and Steamboat Springs.

A trip to the northwestern part of the state included:

- Visiting the former Mount Harris town.
- Requesting access to Mount Harris homes currently occupied.
- Measuring homes in Steamboat Springs and Hayden.
- Creating a template for drawing the houses.








REAR ELEVATION














#### FLOOR PLAN 1 LEVEL

During this visit, the property owners Mr. & Mrs. Kowynia, shared valuable information about their house with us. This Mount Harris building is a 2x4 single family house construction. The owners built an addition where the living room and dining stand today; initially, this house had one bedroom (which they kept in the original place), a living room that is now a study room, and the kitchen, which according to the owners was small for their needs, so they decided to extend and remodel it. The roof structure needed a new beam that supports the new roof structure, but they kept the original bedroom division with the door.



There are 63 buildings noted in the research auctioned from Mt. Harris in 1958, but we do not have addresses or specifics on the auction. Current and former residents identified the homes on the spreadsheet.
